RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR TEMPORARY REVOCABLE WINTER ICE-FISHING ACCESS PERMIT

NLPIA, Inc. is a New York State not-for-profit membership corporation, incorporated in 1925. The Temporary Revocable Winter Ice-Fishing Access Permit allows you access to NLPIA Properties and Nassau Lake for Ice-Fishing **ONLY**. This access is given on a temporary revocable basis. All NYS Regulations and Laws pertaining to fishing and vehicles apply. The Access Permit is the property of the Nassau Lake Park Improvement Association and must be returned upon our request. It is issued as a personal benefit, providing ice-fishing opportunities for the Permit holders only.

1. To be issued a Permit you must first submit an application which will be reviewed by the Board of Directors of the NLPIA. Full payment must accompany the application.
2. By obtaining a Permit, the Permit Holder agrees to release, waive, discharge and covenant not to sue and to hold harmless the NLPIA Board of Directors and/or Members from any and all liability, claims, costs and expenses whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, that may be sustained while using NLPIA property or Nassau Lake. This agreement will be in effect for the entire issuance period of the Permit.
3. If approved, you will receive a Permit that will allow you access to Nassau Lake and NLPIA property for the purpose of Ice-Fishing ONLY. If the application is denied, you will be notified in writing of that decision, including the reason(s) why the application was denied. Any payments will be refunded to you. There will be no right to appeal the Board of Directors decision. The Board of Directors reserves the right to limit the number of Permits issued.
4. The Permit shall specify the authorization for the applicant and their immediate family (spouse, domestic partner, children under the age of 18). The Permit must be carried by the approved applicant at all times while utilizing any NLPIA property for the purpose of Ice-Fishing on Nassau Lake. This Permit may not be used by any person except the person to whom the Permit was issued.
5. NLPIA Stickers should be visible on the dashboard when your vehicle is parked on NLPIA properties.

6. The Permit holder agrees to abide by all of the NLPIA By-Laws, Rules & Regulations associated with this Temporary Access and all NYS Regulations and Laws. You will receive a copy of NLPIA By-Laws and the Rules & Regulations Permit if your application is approved.
7. If the Permit holder is found to have not complied with the Terms and Conditions set forth in the NLPIA By-Laws, Rules & Regulations or NYS Regulations and Laws this Permit WILL be revoked. Upon a serious violation, the Permit may be confiscated and all privileges suspended. Following a review by the NLPIA Board of Directors, the Permit may be permanently revoked and all future Permit Applications may be denied.
8. This Permit may not be altered in any way.
9. The Permits are valid from December 1st – March 31st ONLY. Please note the expiration date on the Access Permit. It is your responsibility to reapply to obtain a new Permit each year.
10. Any children under the age of 16 must be accompanied and supervised by the Adult Permit holder at all times while utilizing NLPIA Properties and Nassau Lake.
11. No structures or shanties of any kind may be left unattended or left overnight on NLPIA property or on Nassau Lake. All shanties must have the owners name and address in letters at least 3 inches high.
12. In New York State, general angling regulations limit anglers to two jigging lines (or hand lines) and five tip-ups in most waters. Each tip-up must be marked with the operator's name and address; the operator must be in immediate attendance when the lines are in the water.
13. Only Certified baitfish are to be used while on NLPIA property and Nassau Lake. Certified baitfish are those that have been tested and found to be free of specified diseases. Use of certified baitfish helps prevent the spread of fish diseases. For baitfish to be considered certified, a dated receipt containing the seller's name, the species of fish and the number of each species sold must be obtained from the seller and retained by the purchaser while in possession of the baitfish. Baitfish without a receipt or with a receipt that is older than 10 days shall be considered uncertified bait.
14. Use of any gaffs or gaff hooks is prohibited.
15. Carry In/Carry Out applies - If you bring it in/take it out. Nothing is to be left on NLPIA property or on Nassau Lake.
